

In the <u>Key Documents</u> section, you will find links to the Junior Cycle Framework, the History Specification and the Assessment Guidelines.


In the <u>Planning</u> section you will find Departmental Planning Approaches, and supports for L2LP planning and Professional Time.










A Checking in on Prior Learning

Focus on the ESB archive

The ESB Archives which collects, preserves and makes accessible records relating to ESB, might be of interest to Junior Cycle History teachers and students, in the run up to CBA1, the window for which opens after Christmas.

The collections reflect the contribution of ESB to the economic and social development of Ireland and contains material on the Shannon Scheme, Rural Electrification, the development of ESB Stations, marketing and promotional material, photographs and most recently a film archive with previously unseen film footage commissioned by ESB from the 1920s to the 1980s.
