

## **Learning Unit "Let's Eat"**

**LEARNING OUTCOMES (What do I want them to know, understand and be able to do?)** 

- 1.13 ask and answer questions and exchange ideas, emotions and information on familiar topics in everyday situations
- 2.2 apply all language learning to creative activities such as producing simple poems, posters, presentations, games and drama
- 3.1 name and describe some features of the target language country/ countries such as geographical features, weather, places and landmarks, food

## **ASSESSMENT (How I know they know)**

Students can name a range of foods in the target language

Students can ask and answer questions about foods they like/dislike using a range of verbs

Students can use what they have learned to create a poem/song or drama of no more than 10 lines

**Possible learning activities:** 

**Introductory Activity**: Flash cards are used to introduce new vocabulary and relevant verbs (to like, to love, to hate)

Practice: Students match new vocabulary through listening exercises

Students practised pronunciation by describing what they like to eat for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

**Placemat activity:** Students work individually and then in groups to ask and answer each other what foods they like/dislike flashcards and then co-create a poem/song or drama about food.

Activities recognise the integrated nature and sequence (receptive --> productive) of second language acquisition
