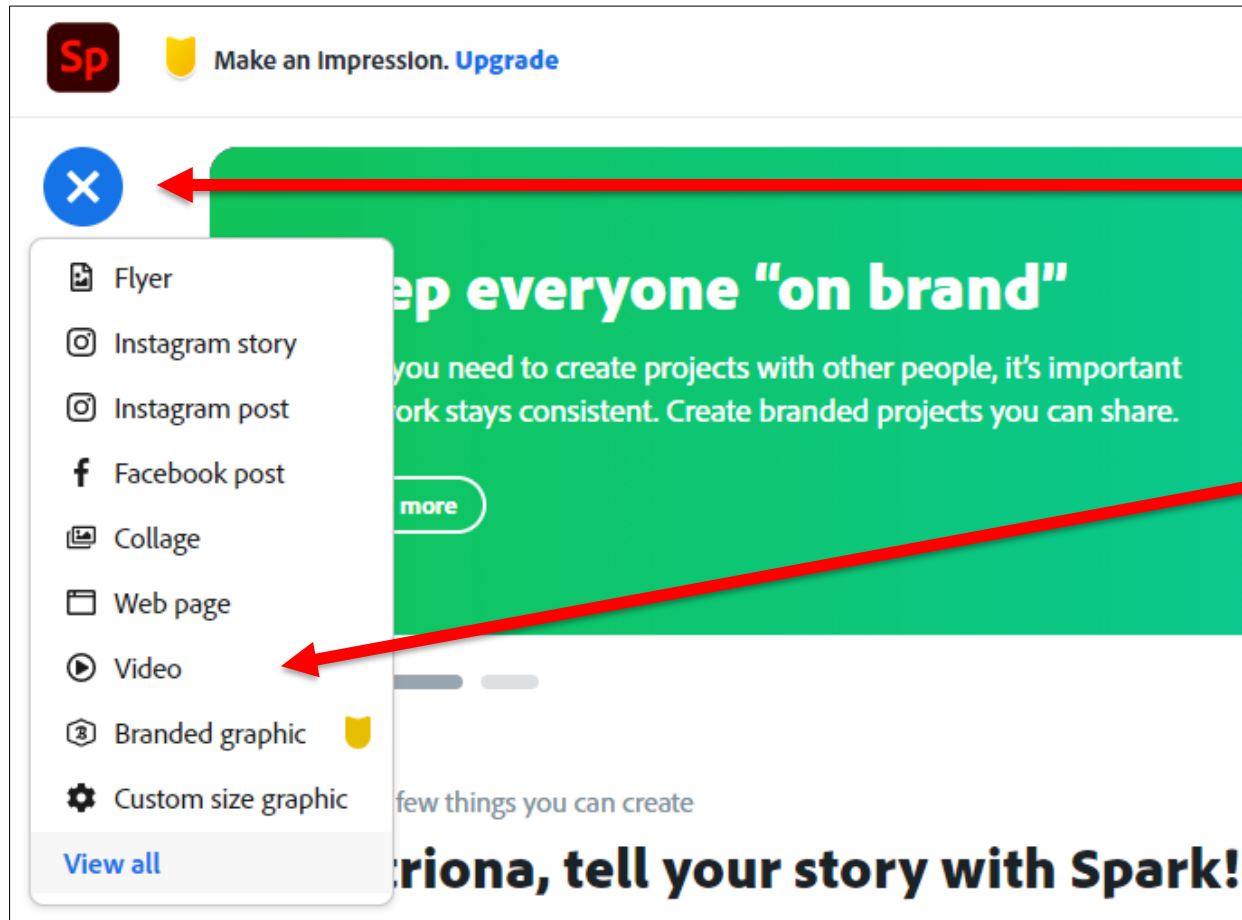

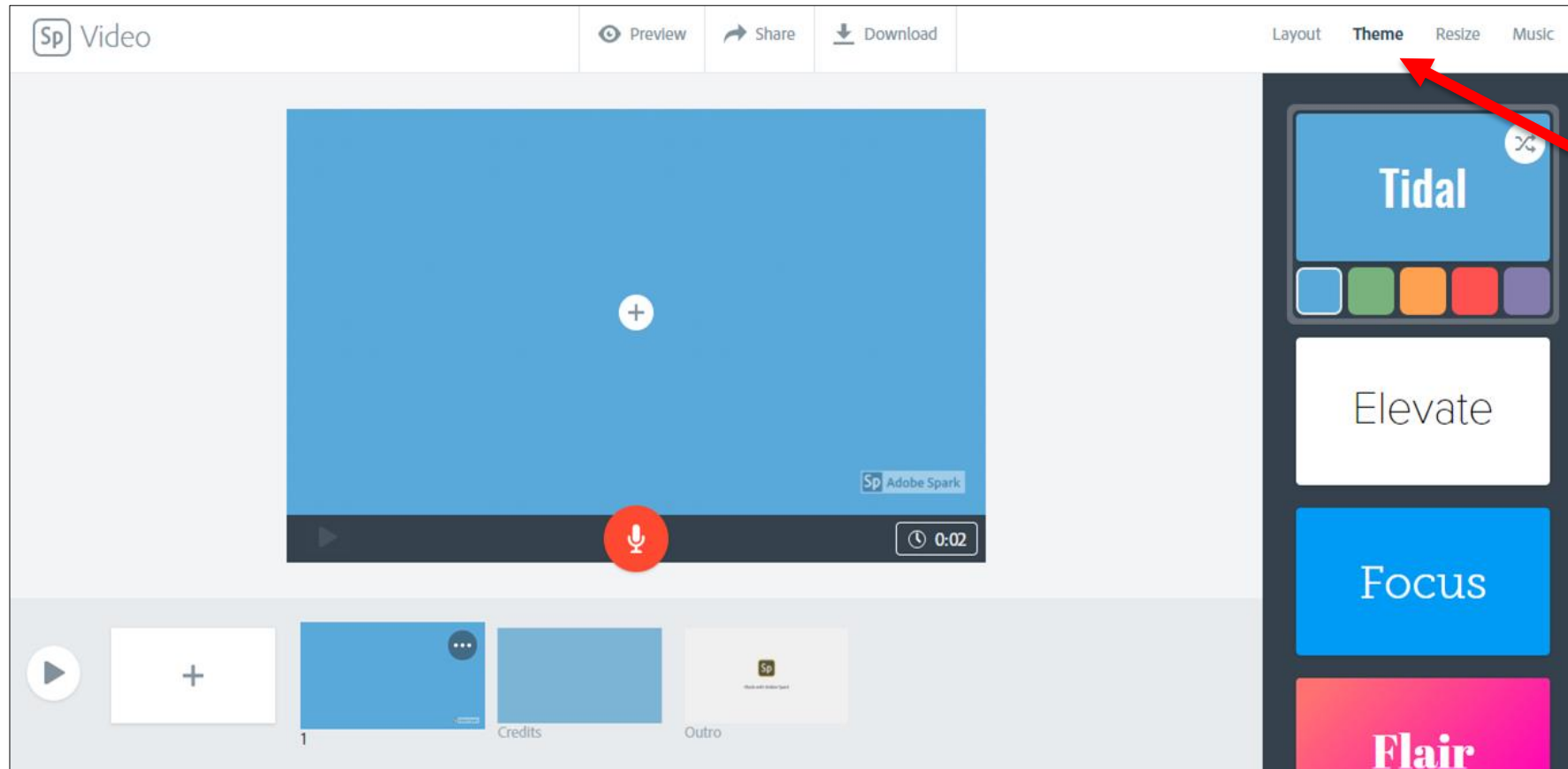

Add and Edit Slides

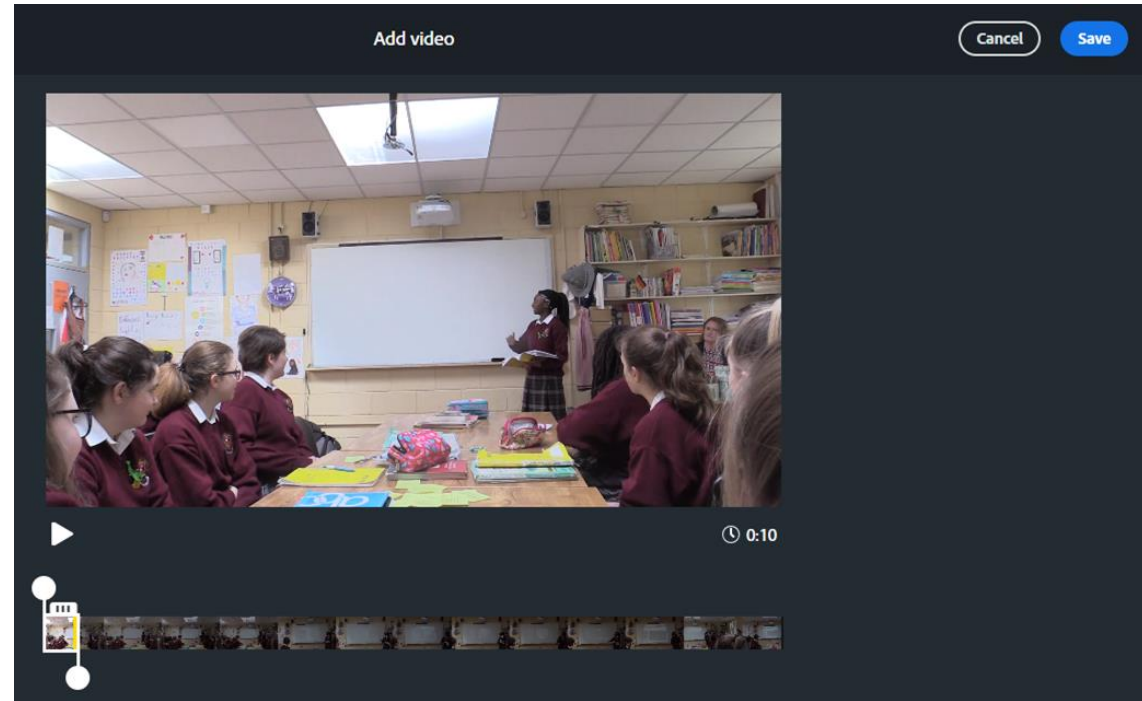


Click on the + symbol on the storyline to add a new slide, then on the other + symbol on the preview panel to select whether to add a video, text, a picture or an icon

Video Editing Panel *Add a Video Clip*



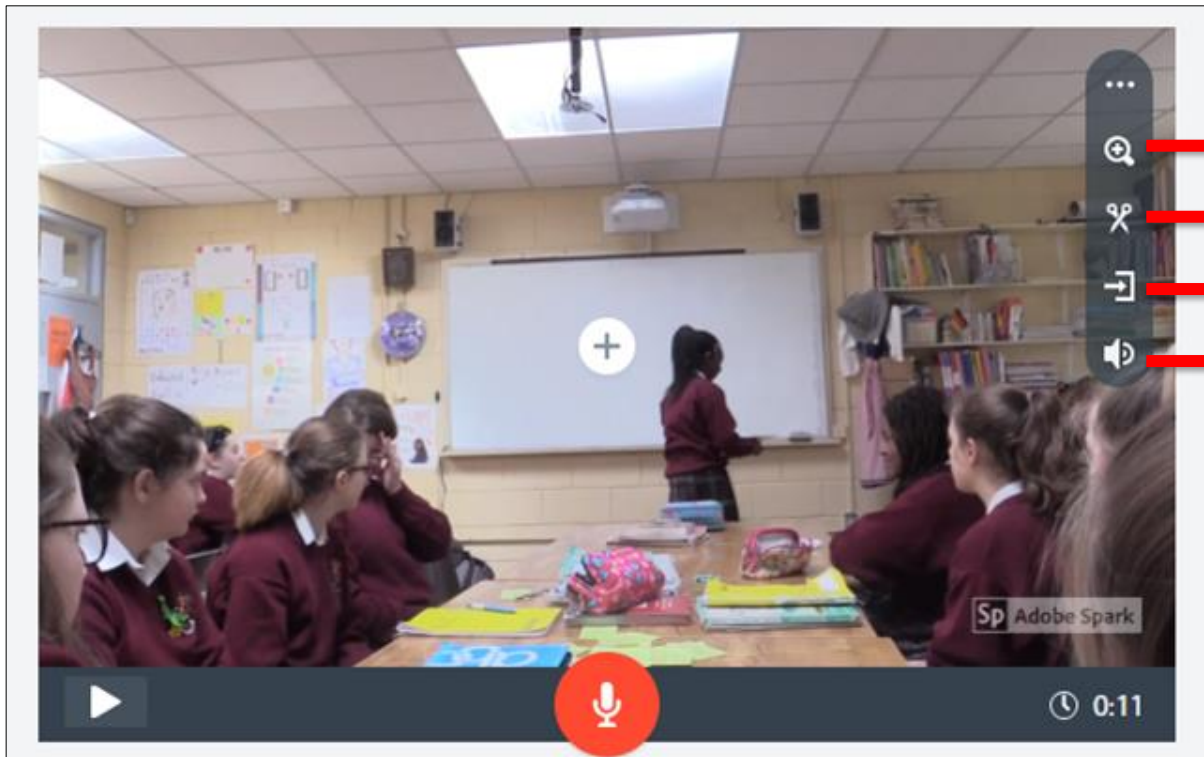
When clicking “Video”, a window will open to let you select a file from your computer. This can be further edited and trimmed

The four options available are:

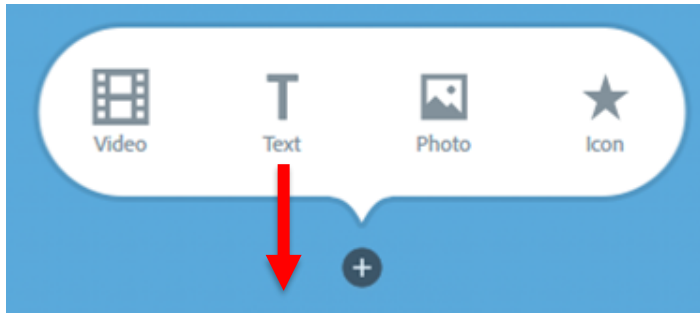
Change the zoom

Trim the clip

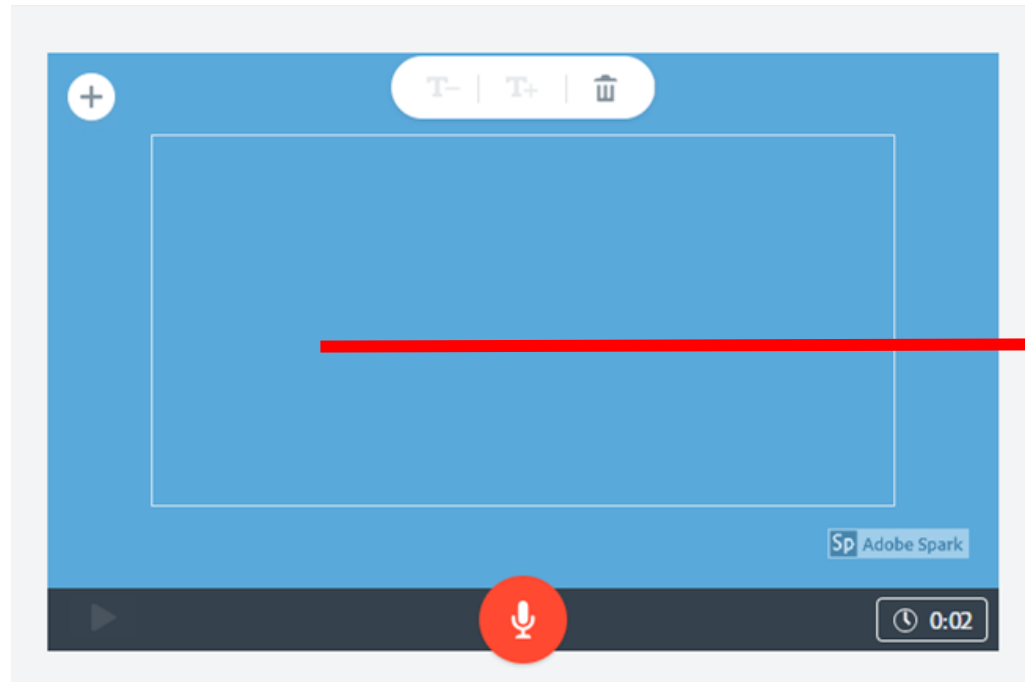

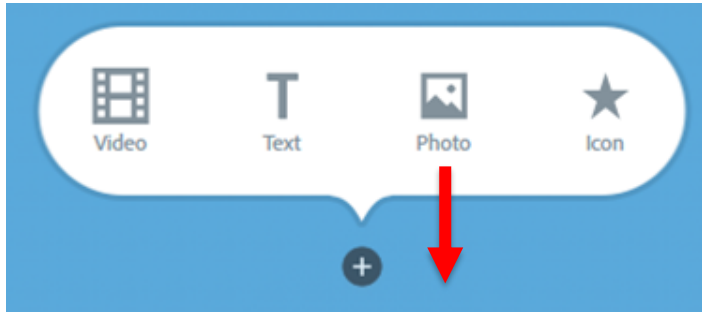
Click on “Text” to enter any narrative, captions or comments



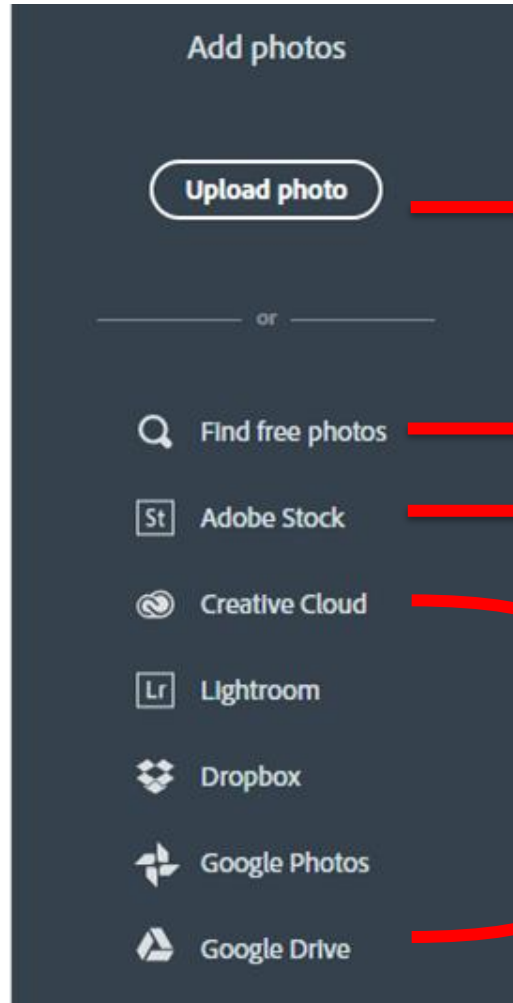
Type any text, increase or decrease font size

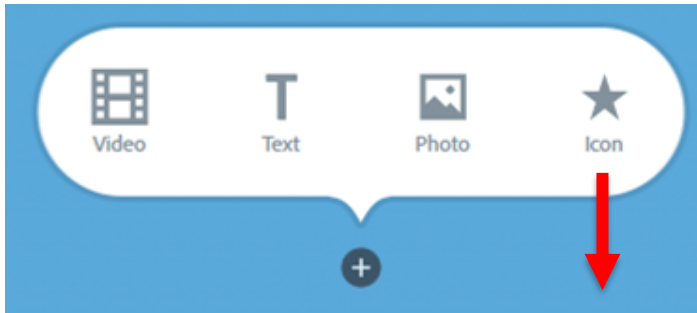

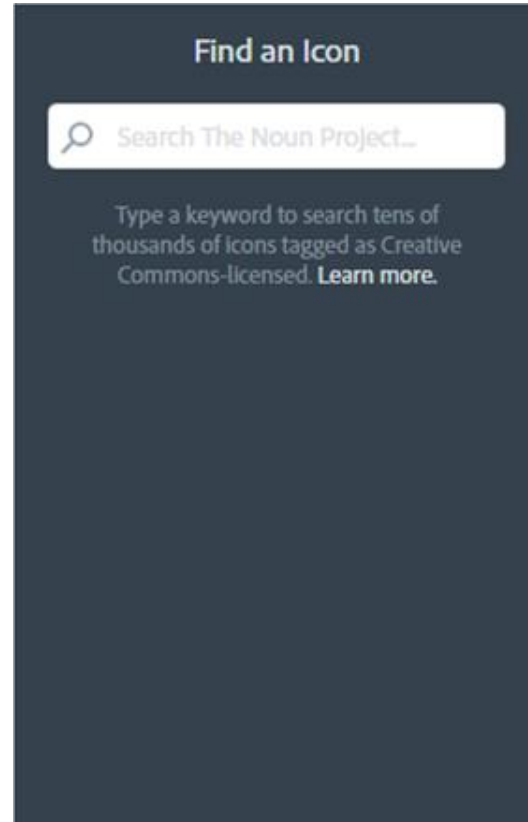

Click on “Icon” to add from those labelled online as “Creative Commons-licensed”

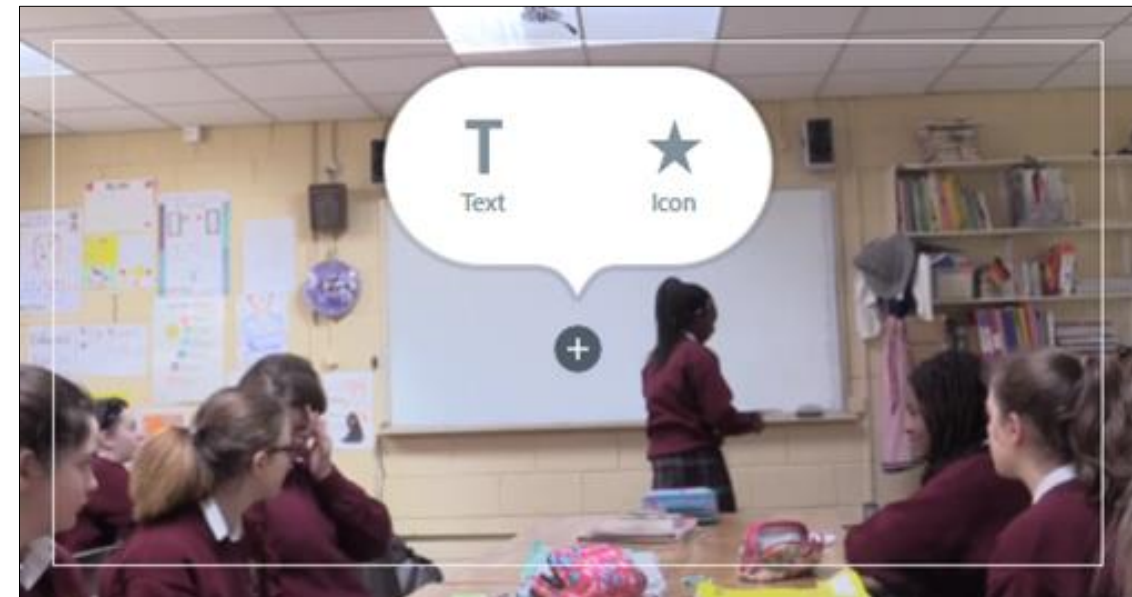
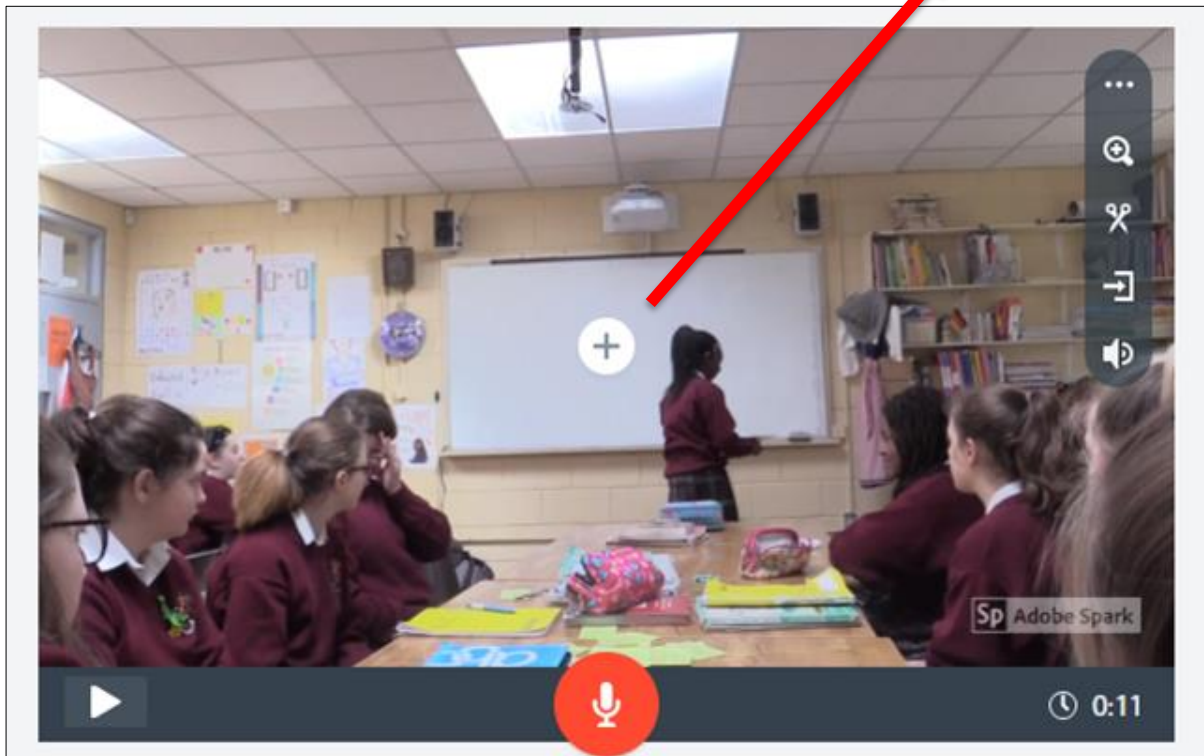

Every time the “+” symbol is available, it means that other editing options are possible by clicking it

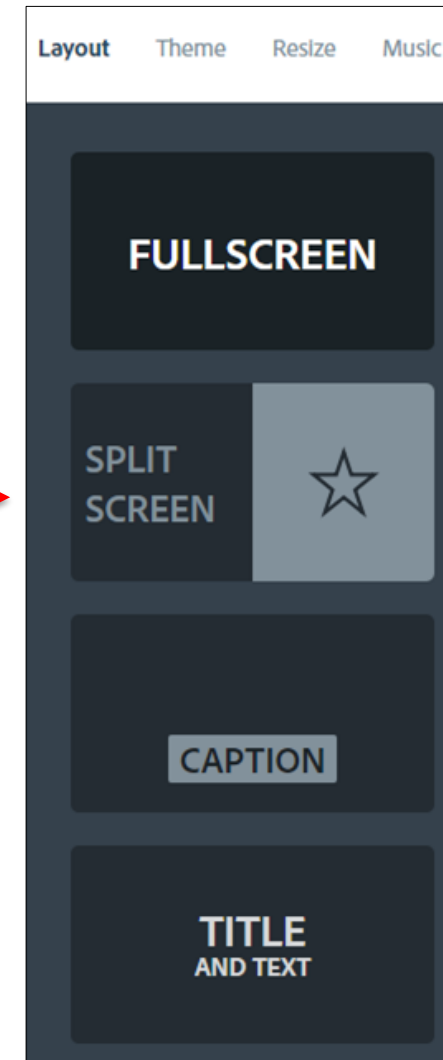
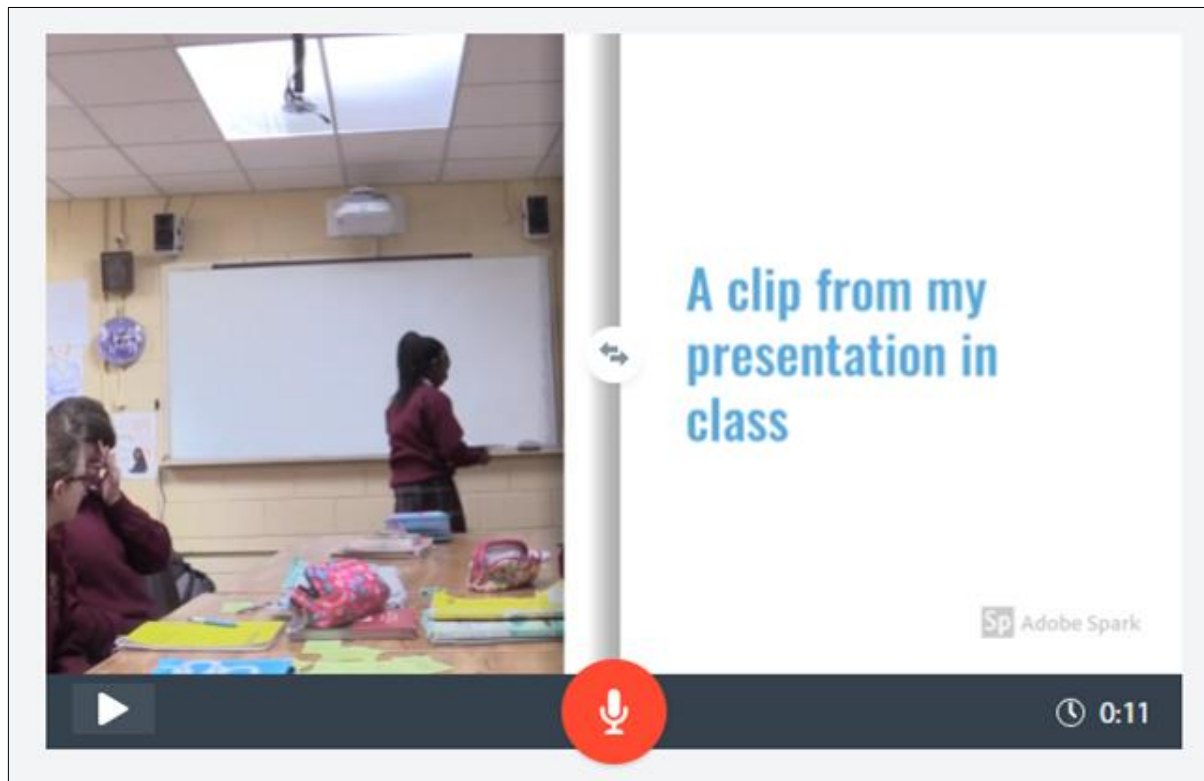


Select Layout of Each Slide




This example shows text added in full screen mode

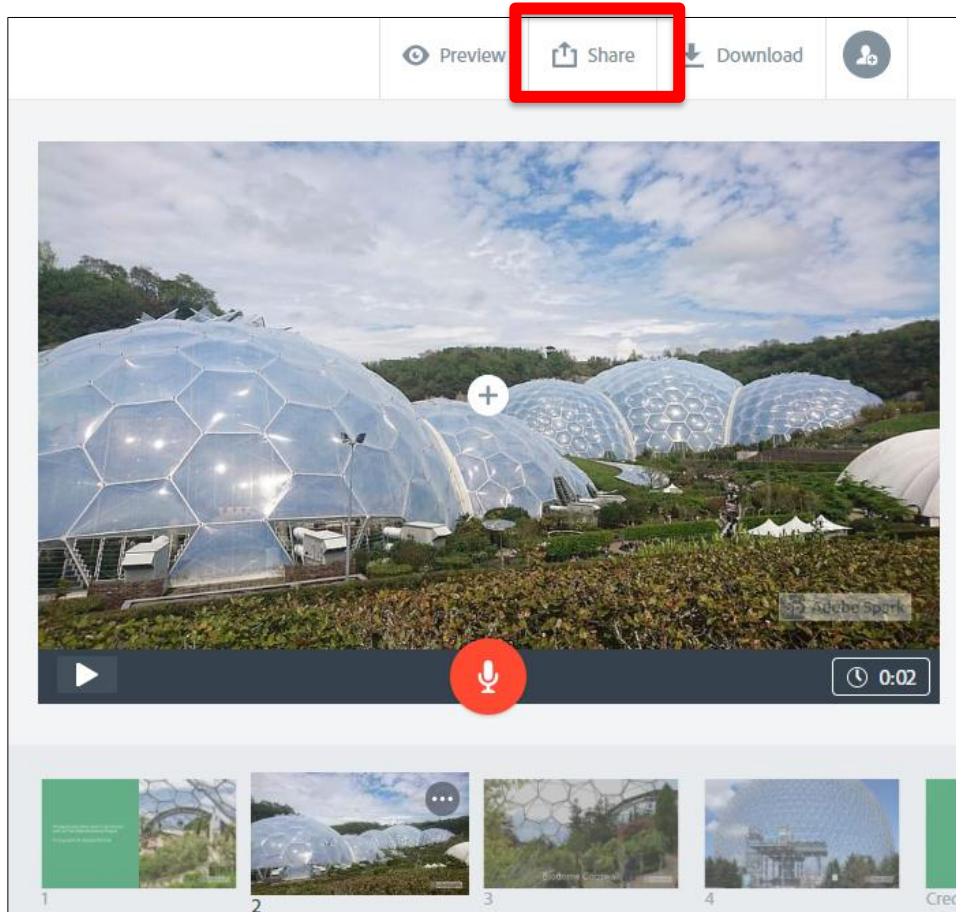

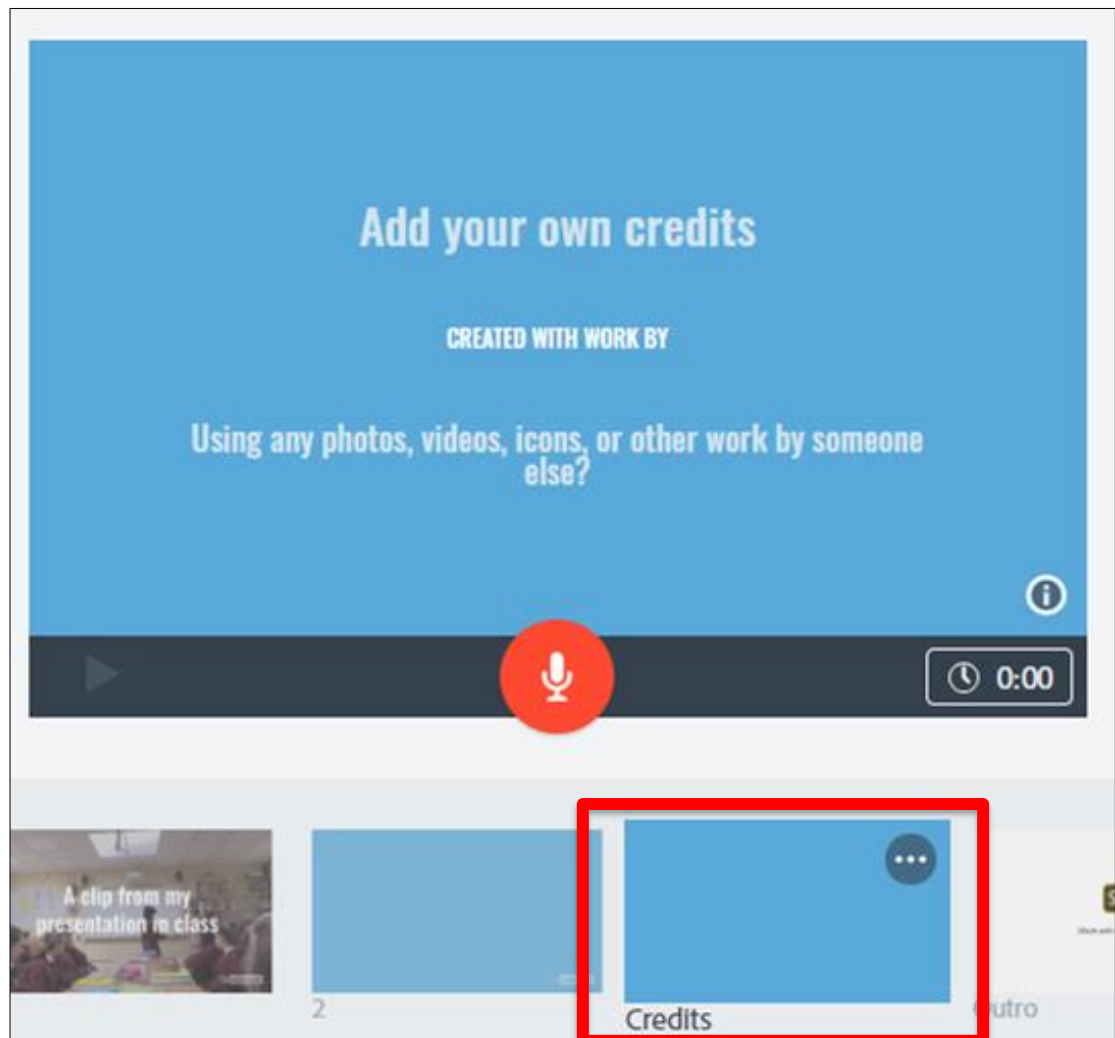
Download a Project
